About the Artists:

Rosalyn Driscoll is a visual artist whose sculptures, installations and photographs explore the senses, perception and the body.

Driscoll took years of classes with Bonnie Bainbridge Cohen and spent a year drawing Janet Adler in movement.

Shayla-Vie Jenkins is a performer, teacher, and maker currently based in Philadelphia, PA. Jenkins spent ten years in the Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Company, and has most recently worked with Yvonne Rainer, Ni'Ja Whitson, the Merce Cunningham Trust's Night of 100 Solos, and Susan Marshall. Paul Matteson is an assistant professor in the School of Dance at University of the Arts. His research explores languages and logics within collaborative choreography.

Andrea Olsen is a dancer, writer, and Professor Emerita of Dance at Middlebury College. She has been engaged as an artist in residence and board member with A.P.E.(Available Potential Enterprises) since Thornes Marketplace opened in 1978 and is author of Bodystories, Body and Earth, and The Place of Dance with colleague Caryn McHose. Andrea has worked with Bonnie, Janet, and Nancy as student, colleague, and friend for four decades and continues to be inspired by every encounter and exchange.

Peter Schmitz has been involved in making creative projects and performing in various mediums of creative work for over 40 years. Maybe you saw him perform in Dance Gallery's production of "Archives' on the top floor of Thornes Market, or in one of the numerous iterations of Roy Faudree's 'Elephant Man'. Maybe you remember a pair of shoes he sold you when you shopped at Chona. Maybe you don't remember... Peter met Janet Adler in an Authentic Movement workshop at Thornes Market in 1979.
